Bayeux

There's no better way to discover Bayeux than on the miniature train! Lasting around 35 minutes, your group will learn the history of the area with on-board commentary in French & English.

Pointe du Hoc

Check out the stunning panoramic views atop this 100-foot cliff overlooking the English Channel. It was the highest vantage point between Omaha Beach to the east and Utah Beach to the west.

Dinan

Visiting Dinan is like taking your students back in time. This medieval walled town is full of charm thanks to its castle, river, narrow streets and magnificently preserved timber clad buildings.

Caen Memorial Museum

The port city of Caen's Memorial Museum is an essential stop for students studying WWII and the Battle for Caen. There is also a section displaying the history of the Cold War.

Normandy American Cemetery

This poignant memorial honours the fallen American soldiers in a stunning location overlooking Omaha Beach. The vast field of crosses clearly demonstrates the sheer scale of loss to your students.

Granville

The seaside resort of Granville is a historic fishing port with views towards Jersey and Guernsey. Students of fashion and design will be particularly interested in visiting Musée Christian Dior.

Sand Yachting

This memorable activity is sure to be a hit with your students and a highlight of your trip. Gear up for a thrilling ride along the white sandy beaches of Normandy with the sea wind in your sails!

Arromanches 360° Cinema

Experience the immersive 360° cinema in Arromanches, where your students will literally be surrounded by footage from WWII across multiple screens.

Bell Foundry

Step back in time on a tour of this 19th century workshop and learn the tradition behind the craft of bronzewares. The bells of Paris' Notre-Dame cathedral were even created here.

Goat Cheese Farm

Learn about the production of one of Normandy's most famous exports on a farm visit, where you'll get to sample some fromage, meet the goats and even milk them if you're brave enough!

Musée du Débarquement

Explore the history of the D-Day landings, specifically the role the Mulberry harbours played in the allied invasion. The museum even overlooks the remnants of Mulberry B.

Battle of Normandy Memorial Museum

We recommend visiting this D-Day museum before heading to the landing beaches, just a few kilometres away, for maximum impact on your students.

Memorial Pegasus

Uncover the history behind the days preceding D-Day and the pivotal role played by the British 6th Airborne Division. Your group will see the Pegasus Bridge and a replica WWII aircraft.

Juno Beach Centre

This museum commemorates the Canadian troops and their contributions. There's a fantastic optional guided bunker tour. The surrounding park still has remnants of WWII-era defenses.

Omaha Beach Memorial Museum

Located on the same beach where the American naval landing took place on D-Day, this museum presents a look at the daily life of a WWII soldier with an interesting collection of personal effects.

Airborne Museum

Understand the role of the American paratroopers at this modern, immersive museum, where your students can even step inside the WWII gliders for themselves!



Abbey of Saint-Étienne

Located in Caen and famous as the final resting place of William the Conqueror, this magnificent abbey is a shining example of Romanesque architecture in France.

La Cité de la Mer

Cherbourg's awe-inspiring maritime museum charts the history of man's adventures at sea. There's a fascinating exhibit on the Titanic and your group can even step inside a real submarine!

Grand Aquarium Saint-Malo

Schedule around 2 hours to work your way through this aquarium in the charming port city of Saint-Malo. It's home to over 600 species of marine life including sharks and sea turtles.

Zoo Champrépus

Be transported through the tropical forest, African Savannah and Australian bush to discover animals including lions, zebras, giraffes, cheetahs and tigers.

Parc Festyland

Inject some fun into your trip with a visit to Normandy's biggest amusement park, with attractions to be enjoyed by primary-aged pupils and young teens alike (not forgetting teachers).

Bowling

Looking to fill some space one evening on your trip? We recommend a trip to a bowling alley for some good old-fashioned fun. Just try not to get too competitive...

Snail Farm

Escargot may not actually be a staple of the French diet but that's no reason not to indulge in a bit of fun on this popular visit. Your students are sure to love (or wince at) the accompanying snail tasting.

Boulangerie

Baguettes and croissants are synonymous with France, so no trip would be complete without a tour of a boulangerie. Partake in a hands-on baking workshop and leave with some tasty treats. Bon appétit!

Chocolaterie
