### **Eiffel Tower**

The port city of Caen's Memorial Museum is an essential stop for students studying WWII and the Battle for Caen. There is also a section displaying the history of the Cold War.





### **Montparnasse Tower**

For the best panoramic views of Paris, look no further than the Montparnasse Tower. The highspeed lift will shoot your group up the viewing platform on the 56th floor in just 38 seconds.

### **Arc de Triomphe**

It's enough to experience one of France's most iconic monuments from the ground—and a great photo opportunity. Buy a ticket to climb to the top and observe the frenzy of Champs-Élysées below.

### Champs-Élysées

Take a stroll along the buzzing tree-lined avenue famous for its luxury brand stores and showy cafés when you make your way to the Arc de Triomphe, which stands proudly at the end.

### **Seine River Cruise**

Take in Paris from the waters of the river Seine on a cruise that will take you under many of the city's beautiful bridges. It's even more magical by night when the city of lights really comes alive.

### **Montmartre**

Explore the winding cobblestoned streets of this charming district, historically the playground of artists and writers. Marvel at the grand Sacré-Cœur atop the hill and take in the views of Paris.

### Louvre

The largest art museum in the world is on most peoples' Paris wishlist—and it won't disappoint. Don't fancy facing massive crowds? Opt for one the other art museums we've selected instead.





### Musée d'Orsay

Get lost amongst 5 floors of paintings, sculpture and decorative arts in a stunning former railway station right on the Seine. Notable artists include Monet, Cezanne, Toulouse-Lautrec & Van Gogh.

### **Musée National Picasso**

This museum houses some of Picasso's personal collection including celebrated French artists Cezanne and Matisse-in addition to the 3000 pieces from the prolific artist himself.

### Musée de l'Orangerie

This often-overlooked treasure in Tuileries Garden displays 8 spectacular panels of Monet's Water Lilies across 2 elliptical rooms—plus a seriously impressive collection of Impressionist art.

### **Centre Pompidou**

This unusual creative centre near the colourful Marais district boasts the largest collection of contemporary art in Europe. Enjoy views over Paris and the Eiffel Tower from the top floor.

### Palais de Tokyo

This hip cultural centre and its free permanent collection of contemporary art is definitely worth a wander through. Check it out on your way to or from the Eiffel Tower—a 15 min walk away.

### The City of Science and Industry

The largest science museum in Europe is a top pick for science and technology groups. With exhibits for younger students and teenagers, there is something for every key stage.

### Musée Carnavalet

The Carnavalet Museum in Paris is dedicated to the history of the city. The museum occupies two neighboring mansions: the Hôtel Carnavalet and the former Hôtel Le Peletier de Saint Fargeau.

### Musée de l'Armée

Groups studying the history of conflict can learn about warfare from the middle ages through to today here with one of the largest historic military collections in the world—plus Napoleon's tomb.

### Conciergerie

Take a tour of this revolution-era prison that once held Marie Antoinette prisoner. Your ticket includes a tablet that allows you to explore the rooms via augmented reality.



### **Museum of Liberation**

A unique insight into the Paris uprising through artefacts, photographs and footage. A poignant and informative must-see for students studying WWII or interested in the French occupation.

### **History of Paris Film Experience**

Bring the history of the French capital to life and watch as Paris transforms before your eyes in this private cinema experience displayed across three screens. Students can even listen in French, too!

### **Lost in Frenchlation**

Why not add an out-of-the-ordinary movie night to your trip? At Lost in Frenchlation, your students can experience some of the best films France has produced with English subtitles.

### **FlyView Paris**

Experience Paris from above on this unique visit. Students will strap into a jetpack to embark on a 360-degree virtual reality flight over the city and its most famous landmarks.

### **Catacombs of Paris**

Your students are sure to be fascinated by these underground ossuaries. The bones of six million people line the walls of the creepy tunnels. Very memorable—but not for the faint of heart!

### **Escape Room**

Put your students' problem-solving skills to the test in this fun activity. There are a selection of scenarios to choose from, but note that this activity is best suited for smaller groups.

### **Les Halles**

When groups want to factor in some free time for shopping, we recommend the centrally-located Les Halles. Step straight off the metro and into the mall, home to many recognisable brands.

### Stade de France

Take a guided tour of the national stadium of France, used to host the French national football team and French rugby union team. This is sure to be a highlight for the football fans in your class.

### Disneyland® Paris

Just a 40-minute train ride from Gare du Nord, it's easy to add a magical day at Disneyland Paris to your trip—and we guarantee it will have students signing up for the trip en masse!

### Parc Astérix

Want all the thrills with fewer crowds? Parc Astérix is a great alternative to Disneyland Paris. The rides are suited to older students—plus, it's a fun way to experience more French culture.
