
## How to book a school trip

# Attraction price guide


We've rounded up our top tried & tested attractions so you can customise your school trip itinerary.

#### Phantasialand

This theme park is a popular choice with teachers as it's a draw to get students on the trip. With six themed areas with rides to suit all ages, this funpacked day is sure to be a highlight.

#### **Rursee Lake Boat Trip**

Pay a visit to this stunning lake where your group can spend an afternoon on a boat trip.

#### **Bad Münstereifel**

A beautiful old spa town characterised by timberframed houses, 13th-century walls, and the river Erft ribboning through the centre of the town. Students can visit the quaint shops along the cobbled alleys.

#### Seilbahn Koblenz

This breathtaking cable car ride transports you across the Rhine & up to Ehrenbreitstein Fortress. Your round-trip ticket includes admission to the fortress with its museum.

#### Monschau

Visit the charming town of Monschau. Attractions here include a toboggan slide, mustard mill, glassworks & historic sawmill. Talk to us about organising a traditional German evening meal.

#### **Grube Wohlfahrt Mine**

Take an underground tour of this 19th century lead mine & learn about life as a miner. Beware! You'll navigate narrow, dark spaces & will need warm clothing & waterproof shoes for this visit.

The best way to see this traditional town is to hop on the mini-train for a 30-minute tour where you'll see its Roman wall, churches and many other historic places of interest.

#### **Rheinstein Castle**

Take a self-guided tour of this 14th century castle, its grounds and gardens. The castle's turret overlooks the Rhine River and is a fantastic vantage point.

#### Wildlife Park Hellenthal

Deer, wild boar, eagles... they're all to be found here. Learn about the park's conservation efforts and, with informative shows running daily, see these mighty birds of prey in full flight!

#### **Marksburg Castle**

Marksburg Castle is a perfect example of the Rhineland's signature gothic style. It includes a gun battery & torture chamber! Set high on a hill, it boasts spectacular views of the Rhine valley.

#### **Cochemer Sesselbahn**

Ride up to one of the most panoramic viewpoints over Cochem, the "Pinner Kreuz", where you can see over the town, river & castle. Explore the walking trails and refuel at the cafés at the top.

#### St. Rochuskapelle

When visiting this chapel, you can walk in the surrounding vineyards that overlook the Niederwalddenkmal monument and the river Rhine.

#### **River Cruise**

What better way to experience Germany's rivers than to cruise along them? We'll arrange a cruise from the Rhine, Moselle or Cologne to best suit your itinerary. Cruises typically last 60–75 mins.

#### **Cologne Cathedral**

A World Heritage Site and renowned as a symbol of German Catholicism, you can enter the cathedral for free. It's also possible to visit the tower and the treasury for a small fee.

This quirky little museum contains over 350 examples of mechanised musical instruments. It's something a bit different and could certainly only be found in Germany!
